



Highlights of the exhibit include an ancient Babylonian brick stamped with Nebuchadnezzar's name, a complete series of lamps from the Chalcolithic to the early Arabic periods, a rare Syrian clay model of a chariot, handwritten cuneiform tablets from ancient Ur, and a series of Syrian toggle pins from the Middle Bronze Age. It is the largest teaching collection of ancient Near Eastern ceramics in North America.


