A Southern Adventist University Board of Trustees meeting was held in the new Hulsey Wellness Center on Feb. 15. The board members were very appreciative of the beautiful center but disappointed in the fact that it was more than \$1 million over budget. Marty Hamilton gave a good explanation as to some of the causes of that overage. Most of the expenses were in the complexities of connecting the new building to the existing building.

In light of the square foot cost of the wellness center the budget for Florida Hospital Hall was raised to \$8 million. Tom Verrill gave a detailed explanation as to how the university plans to provide funding for the two construction projects that included a combination of loans, fund raising and capital budget allocations.

Despite these costs, the January 2009 statement was reviewed and the university is doing very well to date. If we continue the rest of the year without any abnormal expenses we will finish this fiscal year in good financial condition.

The board reviewed the total compensation of administration, deans and chairs and the board expressed appreciation for the faculty and administration for accepting sacrificial wages to accomplish the mission of Southern.

Board members voted to authorize Southern to develop and implement a master's program in social work to begin in the fall of 2010. Another faculty member is budgeted for the social work department for this master's degree.

In addition, Ruth Liu, the chair of the "Keys to Excellence" Steinway piano campaign gave an update on fund raising. Nearly half of the funds have been raised and various events are being planned in Chattanooga to raise the rest of the funds in time for Alumni Weekend this fall.

RECORD ENROLLMENT CONTINUES

Southern continues to see growth in its student body. Currently, more students are attending than have ever before been enrolled during the winter semester.

With a headcount of 2,685 students, Southern has 111 more students than were enrolled last year at this time.

"Our continued increase in enrollment," says Gordon Bietz, "indicates that our students understand the importance of getting a good education so as to be a wellprepared applicant in the job market."

LIBRARY DISPLAYS LOCAL ARTIST

The McKee Library hosted artist Melissa Hefferlin as she introduced her artwork to Southern Adventist University and the community on January 21.

A collection of nearly 40 paintings are currently on display around the library. Many of the paintings originate from private collections that have never been publicly displayed.

"She is extending tremendous kindness to our library," says Joe Mocnik. "This exhibit is a wonderful opportunity to celebrate her art and open our institution to the community."

Hefferlin, daughter of physics professor Ray Hefferlin, studied art at The Academy of Fine Arts in St. Petersburg, Russia. She also attended school at the University of Tennessee in Chattanooga and the Otis Art Institute in Los Angeles. Her artwork has been showcased in Zurich, London, New York, Los Angeles, Denver and in various locations around Tennessee. Currently, Hefferlin exhibits her art at galleries in Ohio, Arizona, and Chattanooga.

Her paintings will be displayed throughout the McKee Library until May 2009.
