In mid-March, I was able to go to a meeting of the Association of Adventist Colleges and Universities. The first part of my meetings with the 15 presidents from North American Division colleges and universities was mostly spent reflecting on ways that we might collaborate.

Some of our sister institutions are facing serious financial challenges. Many of them are being forced to lay off a number of faculty and staff members. It has been recommended to the constituency meeting that a small group be formed to work on the development of a more robust AACU organization to enhance our collaborative efforts.

The joint marketing plan is moving forward as we elected a full-time person to work for AACU and coordinate the marketing initiative. Money for this position has been raised from the North American Division and a private source. With Vinita Sauder's leadership, Southern has done very well in taking advantage of the information developed by the marketing group.

We received a recommendation from the academic officers to suggest to the Adventist accreditation organization some changes to the criteria relative to religion requirements, particularly for graduate education. We agreed to a proposal that would allow cross course registration for up to five online students without charging a fee to the institution where the students are registered. For example, five students at Union College could take an online course at Southern without Southern charging Union for the courses. We hope that this will advance the collaboration efforts of various institutions.

In addition, Norman Wendt gave an optimistic report on Atlantic Union College, indicating that the college could continue to operate.
