In July, **Lisa Clark Diller** presented papers at the Early Modern Studies Conference in Reading, England, and the Restoration Conference in Bangor, Wales.

More than 2,500 people were baptized this summer as a result of evangelistic series through Southern's Evangelistic Resource Center. Next year's destinations include India, Chad, and Central America, and all faculty are invited to participate.

Sharon Pittman helped oversee faculty and curriculum development in Tanzania during the month of July for 13 new emerging schools of social work. She also worked with Open University of Tanzania to build the first online social work courses in East Africa.

Ken and Claryce Caviness, Chris Carey, Tony Trim, and Amanda Jehle spent more than six weeks in Argentina as part of Southern's faculty exchange program with Universidad Adventista del Plata.
