ENERGY TIPS

from Energy Management

- + Recycle your aluminum cans. It takes 90 percent less energy to recycle aluminum cans than to make new ones.
- + Appliances that are "off" still use energy. Reduce energy waste by unplugging large appliances (fans, toasters, heaters, laptops, etc.) when you're not using them.
- + Your car uses more gas to idle for 10 seconds than it does to turn it off and back on again. Conserve gas by turning your car off if you're in a traffic jam or stuck at a long light.
- + Warming small amounts of food in a microwave oven can save a third of the power of a conventional electric stove. However, you waste energy twice over if you use the microwave to thaw frozen foods. Plan ahead and let them thaw in the refrigerator. You'll not only save heating energy, you'll also reduce the load on your refrigerator motor.
