## **Faculty Awards Presented at Commencement**

Students weren't the only ones excited at graduation; several faculty were honored during Spring Commencement for various achievements. Recipients were selected based on nominations made by their peers.

Kevin Brown, chair and professor in the Mathematics Department, was presented with the President's Award for Teaching Excellence, a recognition which included a \$1,500 honorarium. Brown considers it a privilege to be teaching math and is seriously committed to the delivery of this task. He shows enthusiasm for the subject and keeps the classroom relaxed so students feel comfortable asking questions. A student was quoted in the Commencement program saying "he is so helpful and concerned for us. He is always open for questions and never talks down to students."

Douglas Jacobs, professor in the School of Religion, was presented with the President's Award for Excellence in Scholarship, a recognition which included a \$500 honorarium. During the past year, Jacobs has completed his second doctoral degree with a Doctor of Ministry project, specializing in preaching to the elderly. Much of the research was undertaken in local churches. On top of a full teaching load, Jacobs took on a major research project. In November 2013, Jacobs and his graduate assistant rendered a formal report to a plenary session of the General Conference's Research Summit on Nurture and Retention. He plans to bring the project to Adventist universities in Ghana and Nigeria during the coming year.

Rick Norskov, professor in the Biology Department, was presented with the President's Award of Excellence for Commitment to Student Success, a recognition which included a \$500

honorarium. A student of Norskov's quoted in the commencement program said, "Dr. Norskov made it seem like everyone could succeed. His teaching includes creative methods to engage students." To help students explore issues of science and faith, Norskov sponsors the Encounter Club to host guest speakers and reflect on articles

that provide a biblical perspective while illuminating complex debates, such as creation and evolution. Department chair Keith Snyder says Norskov has assisted students in landing research internships off campus at a time when these types of opportunities have been cut by many organizations.

Jan Haluska, retiring chair and professor in the English Department,

was presented with the Distinguished Service Medallion, a recognition which included a \$500 honorarium. He has served students at Southern for 33 years, striving to elevate the level of critical thinking and excellence in communication across campus. One of his former students stated that he would not be a Christian today if he had not taken classes from Haluska.

William Wohlers, retiring vice president for Student Services, was presented with a Distinguished Service Medallion, a recognition which included a \$500 honorarium. Wohlers began his career at Southern as a history professor in 1973. During more than 40 years working at the university, he has impacted many lives. In his current role, Wohlers uses times of crisis as teachable moments, seeking to turn discipline into opportunities to foster discipleship. He has taken students on European study tours and programmed convocations in an effort to extend education beyond the classroom.
