Step 1: Register for classes

Your class schedule determines your work schedule. Consider taking afternoon classes so you can work in the mornings when more jobs are available. Students tend to sign up for morning classes and look for afternoon work, resulting in a wide-open morning job market and a tighter afternoon job market. Try to arrange your schedule so you have at least three-hour blocks of time available for morning or afternoon work. Although there are some jobs with different hours available, most jobs are during the regular 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. workday.

Step 2: Visit areas of interest, but be willing to compromise

Freshmen are more likely to find employment with employers that hire a large number of students such as the Service Department, Food Service, and Landscape Services. Be willing to work at whatever job is available.

Step 3: Check Human Resourses website

Look at the Human Resources website (www.southern.edu/hr) for both on-campus and off-campus job opportunities. Call the number listed in the ad, and make an appointment for an interview. Put personal effort into your job search.
