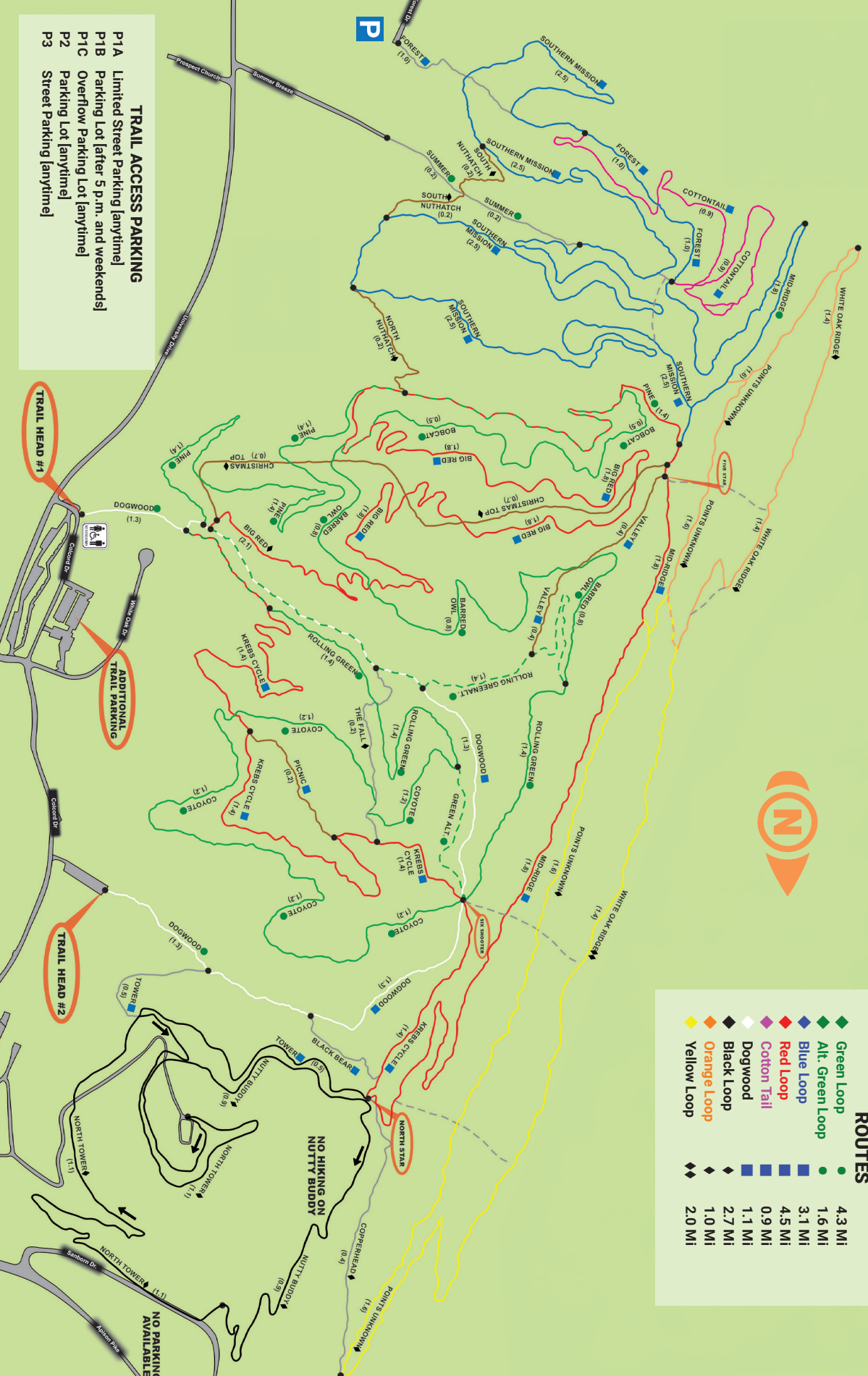

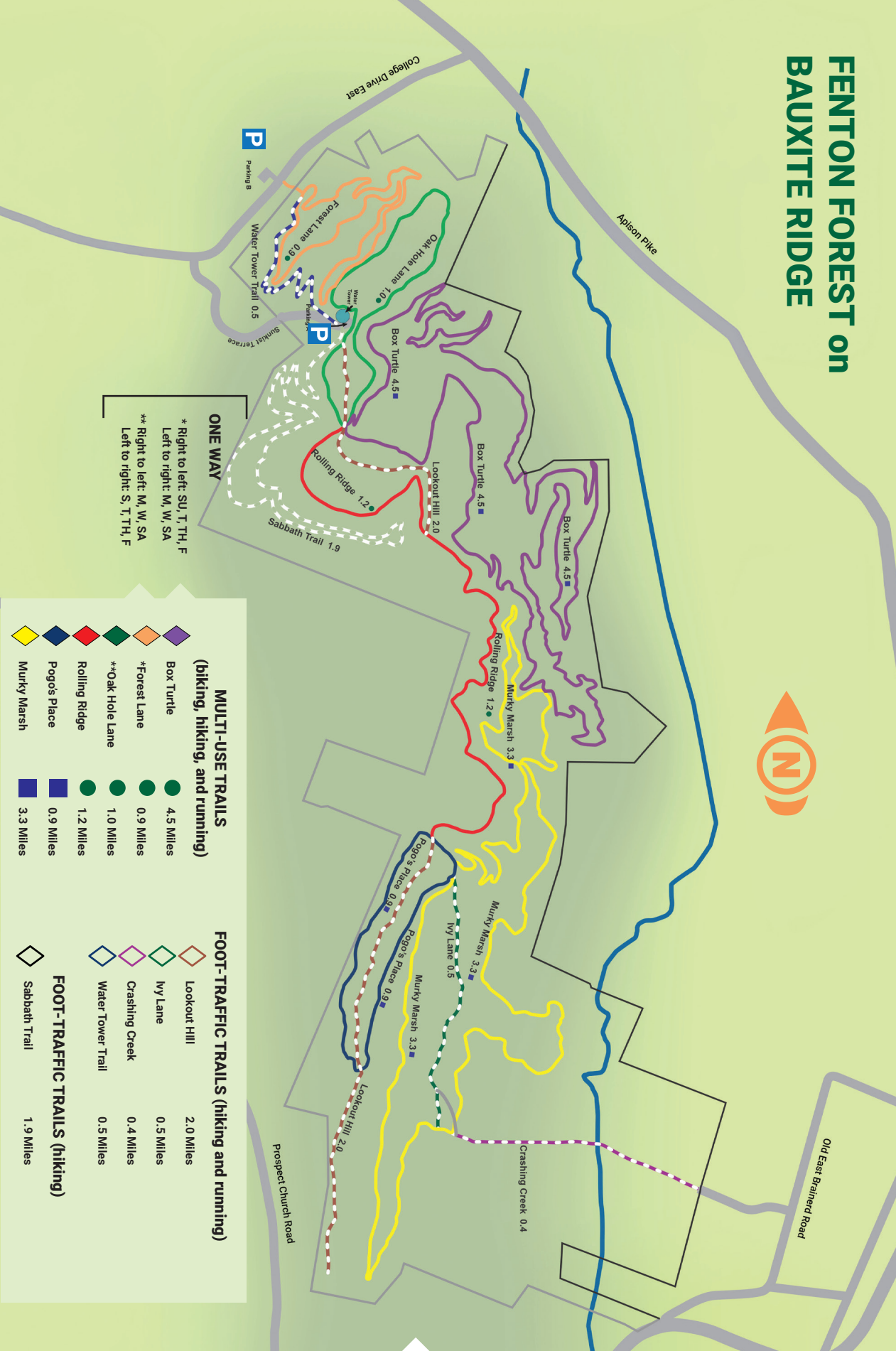

- Trails marked in **Brown** are for foot traffic only.
- Trails marked in **Grey** are connectors.
- Call out to make presence known at blind corners.

- No unauthorized trail building

- Always respect the environment
- Don't wear headphones
- Trails close at 10 p.m.
- Dogs must be held on a leash

CYCLING ETIQUETTE

- Always ride under control
- Yield to pedestrians
- Don't wear headphones
- Helmets are required
