Need-to-Know Hints (Important!)

- § A class is worth a number of semester hours: a 1 semester hour class will be less time & work than a 3 semester hour class
- § A full time course load is 12-16 semester hours per semester but 15-16 must be taken in order to graduate in 4 years
- § 124 credit hours are required to graduate (you may have to take elective classes in order to accumulate 124 credit hours)
- § Course numbers indicate difficulty level and correspond to years: 100 level=Freshman, 200 level=Sophomore etc.
- § 100 & 200 level classes are Lower Division (LD); 300 & 400 level classes are Upper Division (UD)
- \S Before registering for UD classes you must complete 40 LD hours, ENGL 101 & 102, Math 215
- \S Concentrate on fulfilling general education requirements during your first two years
- § Remember your Christian Service Program activities
