## Need-to-Know Hints (Important!)

$\S$ A class is worth a number of semester hours : a 1 semester hour class will be less time \& work than a 3 semester hour class
$\S$ A full time course load is 12-16 semester hours per semester but 15-16 must be taken in order to graduate in 4 years
$\S 124$ credit hours are required to graduate (you may have to take elective classes in order to accumulate 124 credit hours)
§ Course numbers indicate difficulty level and correspond to years: 100 level=Freshman, 200 level=Sophomore etc.
$\S 100 \& 200$ level classes are Lower Division (LD); $300 \& 400$ level classes are Upper Division (UD)
§ Before registering for UD classes you must complete 40 LD hours, ENGL 101 \& 102, Math 215
§ Concentrate on fulfilling general education requirements during your first two years
§ Remember your Christian Service Program activities
