



# JOB MARKET OUTLOOK

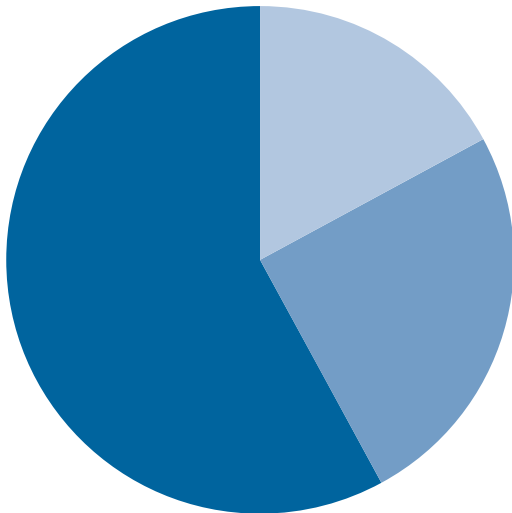
A few entry-level job opportunities exist for psychology graduates, but completing a bachelor's degree in psychology is usually the foundation of further educational studies and career development.

## A RECENT STUDY FOUND THAT

**57%** of psychology graduates go into the workforce directly

**25%** go on to graduate school in psychology

**18%** pursue additional training outside of psychology.\*
