# Record Enrollment for 10th Consecutive Year

Enrollment at Southern Adventist University is at a record high for the 10th year in a row. The university welcomed 2,891 students at the beginning of the fall 2009 semester. An incoming class of 603 freshmen makes the second highest freshmen class ever. This year also marks the university's 14<sup>th</sup> successive year of continuous growth. Total enrollment for this semester is up by 114 students from last year at this time, showing a 4 percent increase. The graduate program grew by 41 students. Southern's student body includes students from all 50 states and more than 50 foreign countries. More than 200 international students are enrolled this fall.

# **Students Give Time and Money to African School**

This summer, Adventist students and staff from all over North America traveled to Africa. There they did everything from construction, painting, working in the medical facilities, and held an evangelistic meeting using the ShareHim model. The three sites they worked on were Lakeview, Malamulo, and Mzuzu. Southern students and staff raised \$22,542.72 for the Malamulu project and an estimated \$80,000 was raised by all of the Adventist schools in North America to assist the Malamulu school so it doesn't have to close. Kari Shultz went on the trip. She cooked, did the laundry and the cleaning at the Lakeview site. There were 27 other students and staff from Loma Linda University, Walla Walla University, Atlantic Union College, Andrews University, Union College, La Sierra University, and Universidad de Montemorelos who participated in this project.
