God and Country

Donn Leatherman's presentation to the combined Adventist Society of Religious Studies/Adventist Theological Society meeting would have been enlightening for any who hold God and country in equal esteem, or who fall into super patriotism on occasion.

Donn's outline laid waste to the idea that a "Christian Nation" (which really means "Christian State") would somehow be good for the church. When the kingdom as described in the Gospels is enacted, "it undermines every state which it encounters."

ASRS and ATS are both Seventh-day Adventist organizations that plan meetings in conjunction with other national meetings of religious societies. It so happens that this year the presidents of both organizations (Donn Leatherman and Stephen Bauer) are faculty at Southern. It speaks volumes for the quality of the School of Religion at Southern.

The president of each organization addressed the joint meeting. Before Donn's talk, Stephen Bauer presented a paper titled, "Identity, Exclusivity, and Inclusivity." His paper outlined the problem: "In order to be tolerant, I must first believe something is right or wrong, but to believe something is right or wrong implies some kind of standard that is fixed." Our relativistic society would like us to be tolerant but before we can be tolerant of the other one must "first have clear, defined standards in order to know whom to tolerate!" Living in a tolerant society is not dependent on moral relativism but on people living with conviction "in Christ" and all that is implied by that phrase.

These were two excellent presentations by Southern faculty, and following the meeting more than one person came to me suggesting that I must really be proud of Southern and these two quality presentations. And I will say that I was – in a humble way!



ENERGY-SAVING FUN TIPS

Have you recently purchased a new refrigerator? If you have, that's great! New Energy Star-rated refrigerators use about half the energy that older models use. So that purchase will pay off in the form of lower electric bills. Or will it? That depends on what you did with that old refrigerator. If you moved it into the garage and use it to store extra food items, then you're probably spending all that you save...maybe even more! When you put a refrigerator into an area that is not insulated—such as a garage—it will use even more energy during hot weather. Add the fact that many older refrigerators lose a lot of their energy efficiency as refrigerants weaken and door seals start to leak, and you may be spending up to \$150 per year. You have to ask yourself, is keeping some extra food items refrigerated worth an electric bill that is \$10 to \$13 higher each month?
