# **New Sculpture Completes Summerour Renovations**

The newest addition to Summerour Hall was installed on February 4. Crafted from clay and covered in bronze, the sculpture displays Jesus kneeling next to a girl on a bench while pointing at the open Bible in her hands.

"This is the last project for the building, and I think it's perfect," said John McCoy, dean for the School of Education and Psychology. "The theme of the sculpture, 'I Am the Way,' is really what drives the School of Education and Psychology. It's all about pointing our students toward Jesus."

The statue is meant to portray Jesus as a teacher for whoever accepts his guidance. Because reading

the Bible can be a challenge for some, Gregory Johnson, sculptor of the statue, embraced the idea of Jesus acting as a personal coach.

When McCoy originally approached Johnson about the project, the artist was enthusiastic at the prospect of creating a biblical piece, but task of deciding how to portray Jesus was daunting since the Bible makes minimal mention of his appearance. But ultimately, those details pale in comparison to the reminder of divine presence in our daily lives.

"While He may not physically come visit students in their dorm rooms, He's there nonetheless," Johnson said. ~Eloise Ravell
