A team of students from the School of Business was accepted as a finalist in the Institute of Management Accountants (IMA) student case competition and presented in Las Vegas, Nevada, at the IMA annual conference on June 19. As part of the Cost Accounting course, students are required to prepare a video that offers a solution to a management accounting problem selected by IMA. Out of 28 video entries, Southern's team was chosen as one of four finalist groups and received a \$3,000 reward. They traveled to Las Vegas and presented live in front of 70 individuals, including judges and accountants. The American University in the Middle East, located in Kuwait, won the competition. Other finalists included Brigham Young University and Southern Indiana University. Past winners have included Brigham Young University and the University of Georgia.

Southern's **Enactus team** was a league winner at Regional Competition this year, securing the right to present at the organization's National Competition in May. Student team members

took advantage of this opportunity and, for the first time ever, Southern placed in its league at the national level!

Southern Family Sets Giving Record

Southern's family came together in a most significant and visible way during 2015-2016, contributing the largest amount ever to the university during a single fiscal year – more than \$12 million. The record giving is, in part, due to excitement from the April 28 public launch of Southern's Campaign for Excellence in Faith and Learning. The campaign includes a heavy focus on scholarship and academic endowments, the new Bietz Center for Student Life (see picture from groundbreaking, left), improved residence hall rooms, and other campus and academic enhancements. The campaign is transformational for Southern.

It is amazing how God has moved hearts to invest in the lives of Southern students, faculty and staff, and our community. At the same time, we must continue to challenge ourselves to complete a campaign three times larger than anything the university has attempted previously. Though we have raised approximately \$33 million through gifts and pledges toward a visionary goal of \$50 million, we still have \$17 million to go before completing the campaign and realizing its full impact on our mission. -Carolyn Hamilton
