PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Lillian Loza, associate director of student finance, graduated with her Master of Science in Administration on December 15.

The School of Nursing, the School of Education, and the School of Religion came together December 8 for an emergency preparedness interprofessional collaborative practice simulation. Students who had received previous training in disaster response took on the roles of “first responder,” “victim,” and “chaplain” in a simulated shooting incident. In total, 61 students from the three departments participated. Heritage Academy helped make the event possible, bringing 12 of their students to provide moulage (the art of applying mock injuries for training purposes) and also act as “victims.” Several community members took part in the event including volunteers from Erlanger Hospital and Hamilton County. Following the simulation, participants took part in a debrief session, online surveys, and recorded focus groups, ending with a “Career, Calling, and Vocation” convocation by **Dora Desamore**.

Luceta McRoy, associate professor in the School of Business, was one of several authors of the article, “The Impact of Privatization on Efficiency and Productivity: The Case of U.S. Public Hospitals.” It was published in the *Journal of Healthcare Finance Fall 2016*, a special issue honoring the late Louis Gapenski for his contributions to the field of health care finance, public health finance, and health administration.
