Bryan Dik is an associate professor of psychology at Colorado State University and co-founder and chief science officer of jobZology. He studies meaning and purpose in the workplace, calling and vocation in career development, and the intersection of faith and work. He has published widely on these topics and is a frequent speaker at conferences, on college campuses, and for organizations. Dik has served on editorial boards for seven research journals and has collaborated on four books, including *Make Your Job a Calling: How the Psychology of Vocation Can Change Your Life at Work*. He is an American Psychological Association Fellow, received an Early Career Professional Award from the Society for Vocational Psychology, and is the 2017 recipient of the John Holland Award for Outstanding Achievement in Career or Personality Research. He lives with his wife, Amy, and their four young sons in Fort Collins, Colorado.
