SOCIETY OF ADVENTIST COMMUNICATORS: School of Journalism and Communication Student's Awarded at Convention

Congratulations to the School of Journalism and Communication who received several student awards at this year's Society of Adventist Communicators convention (SAC) in Denver, Colorado, October 13-16.

Eight students and three faculty, including Greg Rumsey, Stephen Ruf, and Linda Crumley, attended the "Keep Climbing" 2016 convention.

Public Relations graduate, Jessica Anzai, won the 2016 SAC Student Award, and last year's *Southern Accent* staff, headed by Editor-in-Chief, journalism senior Rosanna Hughes, won Best Student Newspaper. Other students and graduates earned honorable mentions, including Terry Henson for best photo, and Lexie Center for her marketing of Studio 4109 LIVE!

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Stephen Ruf, currently on sabbatical, was featured at the Society of Adventist Communicators convention in Denver, Colorado, over mid-term break. Ruf shared video reports he produced documenting the Seventhday Adventist disaster relief effort, in flood-ravaged Louisiana during September. Ruf spent nearly three weeks in Baton Rouge producing stories that were used by the local conference and Adventist Community Services to recruit volunteers and raise funds for homeless flood survivors.

Volume 19 of the peer-reviewed Journal of Biblical Integration in Business

was released in October. **Michael Cafferky** serves as the editor of this publication, produced by the Christian Business Faculty Association.

Annette Heck and Kristie Wilder attended the Tennessee Association of School Social Worker's Conference, in Chattanooga October 6-7. The theme of the conference was "Building the Three R's: Restoration, Resilience, Reconciliation." Wilder gave a workshop titled, "Ethics in a Digital Age," at the Tennessee Association of School Social Workers' annual conference.

The purpose and goal of this class is to facilitate re-entry for Adventist Colleges Abroad returning students. According to faculty, staff, and students, the goals were met. The students are in the process of completing their International Studies major in Spanish, French, or Italian, in preparation for the future that God has in mind for them, utilizing the language and cultural knowledge that they have acquired.

Judy Glass from the music faculty has been asked to present the December convocation at The McCallie School, a boys college-preparatory school in Chattanooga. **Edwin Reynolds** had an article published in Portuguese in the scholarly journal of the Brasil University (UNASP) called *Parousia*. A popularized version of the same article was published in the March 2016 Portuguese edition of the *Adventist Review (Revista Adventista)*.
