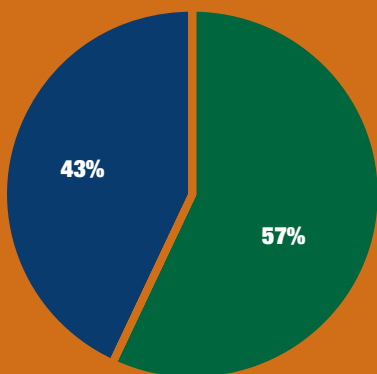


Southern Adventist University's \$152 Million Impact on Region
