## Christian Service Program

Following Jesus' example, Southern Adventist University encourages students to integrate their faith in learning. The Christian Service Program provides students with the opportunity to serve others and share the gospel both directly and indirectly. Service activities may include direct Seventh-day Adventist Christian outreach and are subject to approval as delineated below.

Because it is Southern's goal to involve all students in service and because service is at the foundation of its mission, every student will complete community service activities (Level 1) and service-learning experiences (Levels 2 or 3). The Level 2 service courses are:

EDOE 301, EDOE 348, EDUC 419, FREN 353, GEOG 204, NOND 227, NOND 228, NRSRG 231, NRSRG 340, NRSRG 494, RELP 361, RELP 362, RELP 468, SOCW 201, SOCW 428, SOCW 429, SPAN 354, TECH 115, and TECH 154.

The Christian service graduation requirement is intended to help students develop the abilities to become contributing members of churches, families, groups, and communities in a global society.

Candidates for a bachelor's degree must complete three Level 1 activities and two Level 2 and/or Level 3 experiences. For students transferring into bachelor's programs, requirements are prorated. Transferring sophomores will complete two Level 1 activities and two Level 2 and/or Level 3 experiences; transferring juniors and seniors will complete one Level 1 activity and one Level 2 or 3 experience. Candidates for an associate's degree will complete one Level 1 activity and one Level 2 or Level 3 experience. It is the student's responsibility to identify and successfully complete these requirements one semester prior to graduation.

Pre-approval of all projects by the Service-Learning Committee is required. <u>Student-Initiated</u> : Students contribute to an existing pre-approved service opportunity* for 15 hours, keep a journal, and write a 5 page reflection paper that connects service experiences with the student's academic experiences. Students will submit all documentation to the Office of Christian Service and Learning for evaluation. Pre-approval of all projects by the Service-Learning Committee is required.

\*Some examples of preapproved projects are the student missionary program, Evangelism Resource Center (ERC) trips, university-sponsored short-term mission trips, as well as various campus ministries and student organization community service activities. **English Placement**

Southern Adventist University requires either the ACT and/or SAT national test scores from new students or transfer students. To be eligible to enroll in ENGL 101, a student must have an ACT English score of 18, an SAT language score of 450, or a TOEFL score of 550 (an IBT TOEFL score of 79; a CBT TOEFL score of 213). The English Department recommends completing ENGL 100 or an EESL class before retaking the ACT, SAT or TOEFL. However, passing ENGL 100 or an EESL class is not a substitute for a passing score on the examination.

**Math Placement Test**

Students with ACT Math (16) and/or SAT Math (390) must take one mathematics course (100 level or above).

Math 080 is required of all students who meet neither of the following criteria: 1) ACT Mathematics score of 16 or above, 2) Completion of high school Algebra II with a grade of C or better. If MATH 080 is required, it must be completed with a grade of C or better before the student registers for any other mathematics course.

**Basic Computer Competencies**

Southern Adventist University defines computer competencies as including both concept-based competencies and skill-based competencies.

All students must demonstrate the concept-based computer competencies by:

# Dentistry

**Adviser:** Keith Snyder

Most dental schools now require a bachelor's degree as a prerequisite for entering. Students may major in the field of their interest, but those weak in ACT / SAT scores should seriously consider majoring in a science area. Although a thorough background in the biological and physical sciences is essential to the study of dentistry, a broad educational background in the humanities is desirable. Upper division biology courses are recommended to prepare for the Dental Admissions Test and for the first two years of basic science courses in dental school.

Application to dental school should be made one year previous to the one for which admission is desired. Successful applicants should have a minimum GPA of 3.30 in both science and non-science courses as well as satisfactory performance on the Dental Admissions Test. # Medicine

Secondary school students who look forward to a career in medicine are advised to include mathematics and science courses during their high school years.

Most applicants complete a Bachelor's Degree prior to entrance into medical school. Exceptional students may be eligible to apply after completion of a minimum of 85 semester hours. Applicants for admission to the Loma Linda University School of Medicine should maintain a grade point average of at least 3.50 in both science and non-science courses.

Applicants are also encouraged to obtain experience where they are directly involved in the providing of health care. The Biology Department collaborates with Chattanooga's Erlanger Medical Center in a premedical preceptorship program. This program provides the opportunity for upper division pre-medical students to shadow resident physicians in the hospital for up to 24-hour periods.

The applicant is required to have taken the Medical College Admission Test (MCAT) prior to consideration by the admissions committee. For entrance into medical school following graduation, the student should plan on taking the MCAT by September preceding the senior year. All of the below required science courses should be completed by this time to insure maximum performance on the MCAT exam. To register for specific dates, see the <http://aamc.org/mcat> website.

Once or twice each year representatives from LLU and other schools of medicine visit the campus to interview prospective students. Premedical students are encouraged to make appointments to speak with them.

Most medical schools are members of the American Medical College Application Service (AMCAS). Applications must be submitted through this service. The AMCAS application may be obtained from the Counseling and Testing Office, directly from AMCAS, or filled out electronically on the web. Applications are available between May 1 and November 1 for entry into medical school the following year (<http://aamc.org>).
