STEP 1. Before writing your statement, complete the online Readiness Assessment.

STEP 2. Write a Personal Statement

After completing the online survey, write a statement using the following guidelines. Include the headings provided where relevant.

- 1. Using the APA format, cite at least five scholarly articles to support your observations. (10 points)
- 2. Proofread carefully before submitting. The statement will be evaluated as a demonstration of your writing skills. (10 points)
- 3. **Personal Biography**—Provide a short biography addressing why global development is a good fit for you. (5 points, approximately 1 page)
- 4. **Assessment Reflection**—Discuss items in the Readiness Assessment that stood out positively or negatively to you. (20 points, approximately 4 pages)
- 5. **Lowest Rated Items**—Select five of your lowest rated items and discuss how you will address these to ensure success in your graduate program. (10 points, approximately 2 pages)
- 6. **Personal Faith**—Share how your personal faith will impact your effectiveness in empowering communities to help themselves. (10 points, approximately 2 pages)
- 7. **Field Residency**—Discuss any personal challenges you may face in completing the one-semester field residency at an international site. (5 points, approximately 1 page)
